The Red Dahlia



One of the most striking colors to pop out of the garden is the red dahlia. From the tiny Reddy, to the dinner-plate Nick Sr., to the ball shaped Cornel, reds dahlias are some of our most fancy and favorite blooms. The seasoned gardeners have tricks to get the deepest of colors. LIDS

members have stated they use the "umbrella method"; the excerpt below details how to achieve these bright blooms.

"Many of the competition growers use shade cloth for their dahlia patches. They feel that the bright colors of their competition flowers are preserved when grown under shade cloth. (Old timers use umbrellas over their blooms to keep them from both the fading sunlight and the rain spots caused by the rain). Shade cloth looks a lot like a black plastic tarp. It comes in different densities and dahlia growers use 30% through 50% sun blocking with most preferring 30% to 40%. If you do use shade cloth, you must allow for increased height of the dahlias. A typical variety that grows 4 feet tall in full sun will grow 6 feet tall under shade cloth. Since many varieties grow 6 feet tall in full sun, you need to install the shade cloth to be at least 9 feet above the ground and 10' to 12' may be best."

With Bill Wolkoff as construction manager, Jim has solved the problems of benching up space during spring time start up. At first, hoop houses were placed over two (2) of the smaller beds. The space quickly filled up with potted plants for sale, so a portable green house was built and put into use. Over the years, more beds were added on and Jim had to update the irrigation system, which was not a simple job. Trenches had to be dug, pipes were installed and sprinkler risers had to be erected. All the while keeping in mind the proper overlap of the sprinkler patterns. The irrigation box was also revamped with new plumping, valves and housing. Even when some of the original beds were overflowing from the added compost in spring, Jim solved the problem by adding extra height with additional boards screwed into place.

When you come down on Saturday mornings to work in the garden, keep in mind that many of the hard problems were taken care of by Jim so we could take pleasure in tending to our favorite flower.
